



2) If the verb is monosyllabic, it ends with a vowel + consonant, and the vowel is short (pronunciation) then the consonant at the end of the verb doubles. E.g.: $run \rightarrow running$



4) If the verb multisyllabic, and 2nd point holds true of the last syllable then consonant at the end of the verb doubles. E.g.: permit, admit

5) If the verb ends with a mute -e, you have to leave it out. E.g.: make \rightarrow making

6) There are verbs ending with -ie. like 'lie'. In the Gerund form the 'ie' changes into 'y". e.g.: lie \rightarrow lying Other verbs: die, outlie tie, untie, ...etc.




